The Flowerdew Hundred Post Mill Marker Dedication will be our keynote event as it commemorates the reconstructed windmill that was moved from Governor George Yeardly's Flowerdew Hundred Plantation in Virginia to Texas, thanks to the efforts of Mary McClurg, an ODAP member and descendant of Governor Yeardley. It also marks a first for ODAP as this event will be the first bronze and granite marker dedicated by ODAP. The event also coincides with America's 250th celebrations: the events in 1776 would not have taken shape had it not been for the brave women and men who were the Ancient Planters of Virginia. The dedication ceremony will begin at 2:00PM CST followed by wreath presentations from other national and local lineage and historical societies. Please consider attending and becoming part of this historic event.

Flowerdew Hundred Post Mill • Marker Dedication

Saturday, Sept. 12, 2026 • 2:00PM CST

Lubbock, Texas

*The Flowerdew Hundred Post Mill was the first windmill built in North America, constructed around 1621 at the Flowerdew Hundred Plantation in Virginia. It was built on land granted to Governor George Yeardley. Although the original mill was destroyed, a commemorative reconstruction was built in 1977-78. In 2010, **Mary McClurg**, a Yeardley descendant, was instrumental in obtaining the replica of the Flowerdew Hundred Post Mill for the American Windmill Museum and led the effort in moving it from Virginia to Lubbock, Texas.*

The **Order of the Descendants of Ancient Planters (ODAP)** cordially invites you to attend a **Marker Dedication Ceremony** honoring the historic **Flowerdew Hundred Post Mill**.

ODAP is a lineage society established to honor and preserve the legacy of men and women who arrived in Virginia before 1616. These early colonists, known as “Ancient Planters,” were among the first English settlers to establish a permanent presence in the New World following the founding of Jamestowne in 1607.
